THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 19TH NOVEMBER 2023

Marriage, Family & the Proper Development of Culture

We continue to look at the fourth part of our Vatican II series on the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, Gaudium et Spes.

The second part of Gaudium et Spes begins with focusing on the dignity of marriage and the family, in light of the challenges that are faced in the modern world in these relationships. The Council reminds us that God himself is the author of marriage and has endowed with it various merits and with certain ends in view. We read 'by its very nature the institution of marriage and married love is ordered to the procreation and education of the offspring and it is in them that it finds its crowning glory' (48). In married life Christian Spouses are called to love each other with enduring fidelity, as God loves the Church, and they are made holy as together they give glory to God. Children in their own way contribute to this sanctification of their parents, by their gratitude, affection and trust that they give to them in return for their love. The Council also recognised the challenges of marriage, recognising that 'outstanding courage is required for the constant fulfilment of the duties of this Christian calling', as well as the need for grace found in the Sacrament, for authentic married love to be lived out. It also highlighted the importance of educating our children through witness and instruction of the dignity and importance of married love.

The Council reiterated that marriage and married love are by nature ordered to the procreation and education of children, and that married couples should co-operate with the love of God the Creator in this mission. This should be fulfilled with 'a sense of human and Christian responsibility and the formation of correct judgements through docile respect to God and with consideration of their own good and the good of their children already born or yet to come' (50). The document continues by acknowledging that there are some situations in married life which hinder the number of children a couple can have, but this must not lead to the endangering of the life of children from the moment of conception, through abortion, infanticide or any methods of birth regulation not approved of by the Church in its interpretation of the divine law. This important chapter concludes with: 'The family is the place where different generations come together and help one another to grow wiser and harmonize the rights of individuals with other demands of social life; as such it constitutes the basis of society' (52). It then calls for all members of society to devote themselves to the welfare of marriage and the family.

The Constitution continues with a chapter dedicated to the proper development of culture. It recognises that there have been profound changes on the social and cultural level and we have entered a new age of human history as a result of the expansion of the natural and human sciences, the increase of technology, and the advances in developing and organising media of communication. This has led to positive developments but also creates huge challenges, but *'in spite of these conflicting issues human culture must evolve today in such a way that it will develop the whole human person harmoniously and integrally, and will help all men to fulfil the tasks to which they are called ' (56).*

The document goes onto stress the importance of always keeping at the heart of our work the pilgrimage to the heavenly city, knowing there is more than what we experience on this earth. It also encourages us to share the good news of our salvation, being aware our faith can always enrich the society in which we live. However, it also reminds us that culture must always be subordinate to the integral development of the human person, to the good of the community and of the whole of mankind. The Council also remind us it is our duty to ensure that all people are aware of their right to culture and their duty to develop themselves and their fellows through proper education, and this includes women, who are entitled to play their part fully. The chapter concludes by observing that over the years the Church has contributed largely to the progress of culture and that this should continue by active engagement with those in the arts, as well as collaboration with those working in the expanding world of the sciences. It is hoped that the increase of study of theology will help this progress to continue with God at its heart.
