**Next Steps** Thank you to everyone who contributed to the discussion of our next steps. You have been listened to and we will adapt what we do, taking into account your observations. We are committed to moving forward but we will not rush. I fully realise that we may seem to be moving too slowly for some and too quickly for others. There will be further steps to take and we will consult you about them. We will discuss our next 'next steps' at our AGM on November 6<sup>th</sup> with a view to clarifying our expectations for Advent.

From October 30<sup>th</sup> we will:

- use hymn books again;
- re-introduce rotas for those who take on roles at the Sunday mass;
- re-introduce Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and use two Ciboria to facilitate communion for the greater

number of people now attending -Communion will however, for the time being, remain in one kind only;

- re-introduce the collection within Mass; and
- re-introduce the Bidding Prayers at the weekday masses.

**Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP)** If you are eligible for such certification, please be advised that the closing date for secondary transfer applications is October 31<sup>st</sup>. Fr Philip will be away from October 18<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> October. So do please make sure you arrange an appointment with him this Sunday. There will be a sign up sheet for Fr Philip's availability in the very last week of October – but this of course is getting very close to the deadline. **Synod Pathway.** Pope Francis is encouraging the whole church to listen to each other. In our Parish we will have an open meeting, which will include our AGM, beginning at 2:30pm on Saturday 6th November in Church. There will be the opportunity to contribute for those who cannot make that time. This is our chance to contribute to a global endeavour of reflecting and sharing, culminating in a Synod of Bishops in 2023.
