**Next Steps** We will continue to make 'prudent local judgements' based on the data available to us. It is good news that the Covid related numbers locally appear to be stable or even getting better. We will keep things under review and consult further before introducing more changes to our protocols. However, it is our hope to move into our next phase of getting closer to the 'next normal' after the school half term, on the weekend of the Solemnity of All Saints, (October 30<sup>th</sup>/31<sup>st</sup>). This will probably include:

- Using hymn books again
- Re-introducing communion in both kinds for those who wish
- Re-introducing rotas for those who take on roles at the Sunday mass
- Re-introducing the collection within Mass
- Re-introducing the Bidding Prayers at the weekday masses

To help us with the process: there will be a session for readers, both old and new, at 6:45pm on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>; a session for Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion at 6:45pm on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> October; we also intend arranging a session for servers. If you are interested in these, please let Fr Philip know.
