GREETINGS CARD APPEAL

Caritas Baghita House, in Westminster, is a centre for the emergency placement of women escaping from trafficking and its physical and emotional abuses. It helps the most vulnerable and traumatised people by providing accommodation, medical help, legal/financial assistance and mentoring. The house is owned by Westminster Diocese, and managed by Caritas Westminster. Its partners include the Metropolitan Police Anti-Trafficking Unit, local parishes and the Adoratrices Sisters.

Since opening in 2015 the house has welcomed 123 guests ranging from 15 – 70 years in age, and 11 babies, hailing from 39 different countries. They are provided with the support necessary to build a new future. One guest, who had been living in a state of virtual slavery, said 'one night both my body and mind felt completely broken. A police officer stopped and spoke to me; it was the first kindness I had been shown in a long time. Within an hour of being taken off the streets the police took me to Baghita House, and I entered a different world. For the first time in ten years, I felt safe.'
