Ukrainian Refugee Support

Churches Together in Royston and District has set up a working group to coordinate the churches' response to the Ukrainian refugee crisis. Please pray about how you might be called to contribute to this work. Not all will be able to host refugees, but as a community of churches working with other organisations, we should be able to provide support for both host and refugee families in the months ahead.

This support will include provision of material goods, befriending, spiritual support, help with language skills, form filling and support with access to schools, health service, benefits. etc. There will be a great variety of needs and therefore opportunities for all who are able to contribute.

This means that those offering to host can seek to link with a refugee family, which can be done through various websites, knowing that this support network is being set up to help. We have contact with a church in Romania, which is willing to supply contact details of families wishing to come to the UK. If you think that you may wish to host a Ukrainian refugee or family, please get in touch to discuss it.
