Advent and Christmas 2023

Most of Advent will be relatively 'normal' and follow our usual weekly pattern.

Please note: Our Advent reflections were brought forward because of the shortness of the season this year. On Wednesday 6th we will think about the place of revelation, scripture and tradition in the Church as we continue our Jubilee preparations looking at the Vatican II Constitution *Dei Verbum* at 12:30pm in the Committee Room in the Parish Centre. On Wednesday 13th we will focus on the Church in the world

On Saturday 16th December, there will be an extended period of Exposition during which it will be possible to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A priest will be available from 4:30pm. The Sacrament of Reconciliation may be celebrated at its usual time of 5:30pm on the other Saturdays of Advent or by appointment.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Dec 24th. It will be very difficult to have three masses with sufficient volunteers for Advent IV and four Christmas masses. Therefore, there will be a 6:30pm Mass on Saturday 23rd December but only the 9am Mass on the Sunday morning.

The Vigil Mass of Christmas will the Children's vigil: 5 pm (4.30 pm carols) on Sunday December 24th, this is always the mass at which we get over-crowded. Whilst we do want to welcome everybody, there is only so much room available in our compact Church. Please prioritise making space for young families at this mass, and if you can please come to one of the three other Christmas masses.

The Mass of Christmas Dawn will be on Monday 25th: 9am

and the Mass of Christmas Day 10.30 am
