Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord: This is an extra-ordinary roller coaster of a ride, condensing every aspect of Holy Week into one liturgy. It begins with the blessing of palms and the remembrance of the excitable crowds at Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. If dry the 10:30am Mass will begin with an outdoor procession. However, the liturgical mood rapidly changes and most of the Mass focusses upon the Passion of the Lord, and the long dramatized reading of the Passion. But, as with every Sunday, this is also the Day of resurrection. We will greet Pilgrims on *Pilgrim Cross* in the afternoon/evening. Please be in Church for 4:30pm (with hi-vis if possible) if you want to be part of the small group who will walk out to meet them for their last stretch into Royston.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week These allow us to prepare gently for the great Three Days, the Triduum. We journey with Jesus from Bethany, to the upper room and to his betrayal. Please note that on Tuesday in the Cathedral, the Cardinal, Bishops and Priests of the Diocese will celebrate the Chrism Mass at 12noon. This is where priests renew their vows and we bless the holy oils to be used in the sacraments for the next year.

Triduum – this is in many ways one connected liturgy spread over three days. Please try to participate in as much as you are able as it all belongs together.

Holy Thursday Is a rich liturgy in which we join Christ and his Disciples for the Mass of the Lord's Supper. We dramatically relive the call to service in the footwashing as we recall the Institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood. There is a prayerful watch after the mass as we stay a while with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. If you are willing to lend pot plants, such as Parlour Palms, to form our pop-up Garden of Repose, please let Fr Philip know. He will be available to receive any pots you are willing to lend for 24 hours at 9:30am on Thursday morning, but we can arrange other times if this is inconvenient. Your plants may be collected on Good Friday. Good Friday is our day of prayer and reflection before the cross of Jesus. Children are especially welcome at the 12 noon Stations of the Cross. We will gather as a community before our crucified Lord at the Solemn Liturgy at 3pm.

The Easter Vigil is a time of light and joy as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ Jesus. Weather permitting, we will begin around the New Fire at 8pm in the garden. We will keep vigil as we journey through the unfolding of God's love through the Old and New Testaments, culminating with the first mass of Easter.

Easter Day: The Day of Resurrection, the day of joy and hope and new life, "The feast of feasts" and "the solemnity of solemnities" (CCC 1169)

Not least this day we celebrate the grace of God we receive in Baptism, empowering us now and leading us into God's good future.
