4th Sunday of Lent

Fr. Duncan writes: The fourth Sunday of Lent 'Laetare Sunday' is named from the opening words of the Entrance Antiphon of today's Mass 'Rejoice Jerusalem'. Today, we celebrate in a special way the joy of knowing that we have been reconciled to God through Jesus Christ. We are invited to reflect on the times when we have received and given forgiveness, reminding ourselves that our faith is the source of true happiness. As we give thanks today for all his blessings we ask the Lord that we also may be lights of hope and love to the people we meet in our daily lives.

This Sunday is also Mothering Sunday, when we focus our prayer on our mothers. We thank God for all the blessings we have received from our mothers, for the love and example they have shown us. Let us pray, especially today, for all mothers as they strive to bring up their children in today's world, with so many pressures and difficulties. We remember in a special way all mothers who have died and celebrate this day in the company of Mary, Mother of God, Mother of Jesus Christ, Mother of the Church.

Coronavirus - Covid 19

Last Wednesday, we heard from the Bishops Conference that all public Masses and other celebrations in the church are to be suspended throughout the country until further notice. Both Fr Sebastian and I will continue to celebrate Mass each day privately, that Is without a congregation. In the letter we received from the Bishops Conference, they wrote; Knowing that the Mass is being celebrated; joining in spiritually in that celebration; watching the live-streaming of the Mass; following its prayers at home; making an act of spiritual communion: this is how we share in the Sacrifice of Christ in these days. These are the ways in which we will sanctify Sunday, and indeed every day. Our church will be open each day for private prayer from 8.30am to 12.00 noon. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament each day. On Sundays, the church will also be open from **5.30pm** to **6.30pm**.

It is important that during this time when visiting our church, we will observe with great care the practices of hygiene and the guidance on social distancing. We are also reminded that in these emergency circumstances, and for as long as they last, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed.

In his letter to the clergy last Wednesday, the Cardinal wrote:

It breaks my heart to know that Catholics in this country are now being deprived of the consolation of attending the Holy Mass personally, and that this will be the case for some time to come. I know you will be bearing the same sorrow and frustration. Yet this is what we must do. The reasons are perfectly clear and compelling. It would be irresponsible and potentially scandalous not to follow the formal and official advice we have received.

This is a particularly difficult and challenging time for us all. A vital aspect of these challenging times is our care for each other. There are so many ways in which we are to do this: being attentive to the needs of our neighbour, especially the elderly and vulnerable.

This gift of the personal faith of the people of our parish will unite us to the country as we seek once again the prayers and protection of the Mother God. In order to prepare for the Re-dedication, the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham from the Slipper Chapel has been visiting every Catholic Cathedral in the country. A suggested prayer format will be available during the week.

Food Bank Collection

The SVP will continue to hold a collection in Lent for the Hillingdon Food Bank. The spread of coronavirus means there's a possibility that we may now no longer be able to count on their good will and generosity to keep food banks open." If you would like to change and make your regular donation through Bankers Order, please complete a form, available in the Church foyer and return to the presbytery or set up online and advise the parish office.

Please check your envelope number (same as last year), and your name as you collect your envelopes and email Anne in the office if there are discrepancies. I wish to thank all those who use either planned giving envelopes or standing orders to make their contribution to the running of our parish. This is a great help to me and the Finance Committee in planning for the future needs of our parish. I know that people are very generous in their offerings, but there may be some who wish to take this opportunity to reflect on what they give to the Church. For what it is worth, the late Cardinal Hume suggested that everyone might consider the equivalent of one hour's income as the basis for deciding how much to give each week. Many still give loose change. As you can imagine the bills for our buildings for repair and maintenance, electricity and heating are enormous and those buildings are here for you. May I ask everyone to consider how much they are giving to the Church and whether some could not give a little more by:

· Adding 25p to every £1.00 that you give through Gift Aid. Please sign up to Gift Aid if you do not already do so, or if you are not sure whether you have filled a Gift Aid Form in the past. If you are a tax-payer or make a regular donation, we can claim back the tax, which will add an extra 25p to every £1.00 at no cost to you. It only involves a simple form.
