6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Fr. Duncan writes: Wednesday this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Season of Lent. Masses on Ash Wednesday are at *10.00am* and *8.00pm*. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at each Mass. **Please Note**: Ash Wednesday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence.

In his Pastoral Letter for this weekend, the Cardinal asks us to 'celebrate Ash Wednesday at home, with your family, in the household or support bubble of which you are a part. Gather for a while. Read the prayer which I offer'. I have put on our website a service we can use; 'Ash Wednesday At Home'. It is very straightforward and will help us as we begin Lent this year, in these most unusual times.

This Lent will be very different from usual. During this pandemic, when so many people are shielding we will not be able to come to church as we would like. We are very fortunate to have the live stream in the church. This means people can join us for Mass each day. On Friday evenings, we will have the Stations of the Cross at **7.30pm**. please try and join us for this traditional Lenten Devotion.

During Lent, it is traditional for us to 'give up' something we like, as a penance. This we can still do and all should all try to do something. Fasting is an important way to keep Lent. But I would also like to encourage you to be positive and take on something extra during Lent as well. We can make time each day for Mass, say the Rosary, maybe some spiritual reading. This is part of our spiritual preparation for the celebration of Christ's Resurrection at Easter. Now is the time for us to decide what we will be doing during Lent this year. Then we will be ready to begin on Wednesday.

Please note: The church has a reduced capacity in order to comply with Covid19 regulations. If you want to come to Mass on Ash Wednesday, you need to book a place.

On Ash Wednesday we will be holding a special liturgy for children and their families via zoom at **11am**. (Zoom Meeting ID: **844 0908 4760**). Children's Masses

While we are in lockdown, the Saturday Children's Mass is suspended. The Children's Mass on Sunday at **10.30am** will be celebrated on Zoom to allow the children and their families to actively participate. Please join from **10:20am** so we are ready to begin Mass promptly, Meeting ID: **844 0908 4760**. When the lockdown ends, we can resume Masses in the hall and in the church.

Celebration of Mass continues

During lockdown, you are permitted to leave your home to come to church, to your Place of Worship. Masses in our church will continue each day and will also be live streamed to enable those who are shielding to join us and participate. As a parish, we have worked very hard to ensure that the church is safe. When you come to the church, it is important to remember to wear a face mask, sanitize your hands as you enter and keep your distance while in the church. You must also not mix with others outside your family bubble. At the end of Mass, please go straight home and do not stand around talking with others. If we do what we can, we will all be safe and prevent the spread of the terrible virus. We must all play our part!
