# 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Gospel Reflection - Luke 16:19-31

The story is about the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man has lived a lavish lifestyle with no concern for anyone else and at the time of his death he is set to spend eternity with Hades. Lazarus has lived a difficult, lonely and painful life and at his death is carried away by angels. While this was written about a society in another country, for people of another faith, millennia ago the message is timeless. It doesn't mean that it is a sin to be rich or to have money. The sin is to ignore those struggling around you. The sin is to flaunt your wealth. The sin is selfishness and pride. Earthly riches mean nothing in the afterlife. Those that are cast out by society or don't fit in with the norms of a society, are loved and valued by God. The rich man wanted to send a message back to earth to warn his brothers to change their ways. But Abraham tells the rich man 'they have Moses and the Prophets, let them listen to them'. Getting to Heaven isn't just about piety towards God. It is about taking action and sacrifice. This reminds us of more than one of the pillars of Catholic Social Teaching and leads us to ask ourselves: Are you like the rich man, blind to the struggles of others? What can you do to give back to society? Is there somewhere you can volunteer your time? Do you treat everyone with the dignity they deserve? Are you really listening to the message of the Gospels?

It was a week full of lots of hard work but know that this was an extremely rewarding experience for the young people, physically, spiritually and emotionally and the majority of the group plan to return next year.

Thank you to all who supported their fundraising by buying a cake, having their car washed, sending their child to the disco and in other ways.

Last term our middle youth group (school years 6, 7&8) took part in a sponsored sleep out to raise money for the homeless charity 'The Passage'. The group had been working on their social justice project for months before the sleep out in April, having chosen homelessness as their topic back in January. 25 children took part in the sleep out and raised over £2000. A small group were invited to the Passage headquarters in Westminster for a tour and to present the cheque.
