Fr. Paulo writes:-

At my ordination day, at the centre of the Cathedral were placed the relics of St. John Southworth, a priest who worked around the area of present day Westminster Cathedral with the people suffering with the plague, but was then condemn by the anti-Catholic laws of the time and martyred in 1654. His relics are displayed as the saint lying down, with his face looking upward, fully dressed as a priest. On my ordination day, Cardinal Vincent said these beautiful words at the homily:

'Shortly, these candidates will prostrate themselves on the floor of the Cathedral, taking up a posture of utter vulnerability, of self-abandonment. They do so as a sign of dying to self, so that Christ may raise them up to a new life in him...They do so in the company of St. John Southworth, whose mortal remains, our precious relics, are there alongside them. But if you look more closely, we will notice that the saint lies with his face turned upward to God, already full of the glory of the Risen Christ. For our part, we prostrate ourselves face downwards, knowing that we depend on God's mercy and grace. The one who is dead is now fully alive in God. We who are alive seek to die in Christ so he may live in us...'

The Feast of All Saints is truly a feast that should fill us with hope because in them we see the result of the work of sanctification that God performs in each one of us; when we look at the Saints, or read their story, we should not think: 'I would never be able to do that, suffer like that, live like that'...Whatever great or small work that the saints performed, it was not done just trusting their own strength, but by keeping their faces turned upward to God, already full of the glory of the Risen Christ. Jesus is the one who can do all in all.

As St. John Paul II said many times, we should never be afraid of being saints! God will continue to work in us and through us so that His holy grace may touch many through us, so that we may be his instruments in the sanctification of many. The Saints want us to be with them; The ones who are dead are now fully alive in God. We who are alive seek to die in Christ so he may live in us...May this be fulfilled in us. Amen
