I will arise and go to my father and say: Father I have sinned against heaven and against you...

These words marks the beginning of a way of conversion to the young man, who having spent everything he had looking for happiness and finding none, realises that happiness was always there, in being with the father. The journey he embarks on leads him back through a path of humility, a path he treaded before, full of wealth and arrogance. People would have seen him then, richly dressed, surrounded by so-called friends (friends of his wealth and popularity more likely) and other forms of company, maybe making fun of those less fortunate. May be some would have tried to give him advice, asking him to be responsible with his life, his wealth, his health, but he would not listen...

Now he treads this path a broken man, dirty, wounded, abandoned, alone. People now may mock him as they see him. Others may just say 'I knew this would happen...' and offer no further help. Yet something on this young man's face has changed: there is a hope, a certainty, a vigour to reach a destination, as he now knows he is facing the right direction, he knows where he is going...'I am going back to my father!'

We know the end of his story: an embrace, a restoration of his dignity as son of his father, a feast.

This story stands a good route plan in our path of conversion during Lent: turning towards the father, enlivening our hope through prayer, lightening our journey through almsgiving, focusing our way by ridding ourselves of superfluous things through fasting. We all know what will happen when we reach the father: an embrace, a restoration of his dignity as a child of the father, a feast.

May God bless us all as we continue on our Lenten Journey.
