Looking towards Heaven

'Shortly, these candidates will prostrate themselves on the floor of the Cathedral, taking up a posture of utter vulnerability, of self-abandonment. They do so as a sign of dying to self, so that Christ may raise them up to a new life in him... They do so in the company of St. John Southworth, whose mortal remains, our precious relics, are there alongside them. But if you look more closely, we will notice that the saint lies with his face turned upward to God, already full of the glory of the Risen Christ. For our part, we prostrate ourselves face downwards, knowing that we depend on God's mercy and grace. The one who is dead is now fully alive in God. We who are alive seek to die in Christ so he may live in us...'

These striking words were spoken by the Cardinal Vincent on the day of my ordination to the priesthood. I remember asking the Cardinal to have the grace of being ordained as close as possible to the feast of St. John Southworth, 27th June, under whose patronage I wanted to entrust my priesthood. He was a Catholic priest martyred during the Reformation on the 28th June 1654. Most of his priestly work was carried out in Westminster, close to area where the Cathedral now is. His body is kept in a glass coffin in the chapel of the English Martyrs (the relics are always in the Cathedral. You can visit them anytime).

These words have at the very centre the call of every Christian: to die in Christ so as to live in Christ; to live a life that look towards heaven. In the beautiful play of words, 'The one who is dead is now fully alive in God, 'it is well portrayed how much more alive St. John Southworth is for having died for Christ, than we who live and are still in constant danger of death, not only physical, but also spiritual. So much has happened recently which challenges our faith, our relationship with God and with each other. Yet, it only takes one simple look at St. John Southworth's relics for us to be able to dispel any doubt, for those relics speak of something that is greater than what we call happiness or love; and that is a real, divine and concrete love for God and for the neighbour.

May the intercession of St. John Southworth help us to receive and give this love which is eternal, unconditional, worth living and worth dying for, and that love is God.
