Seeing Red

After Pentecost, the Church entered into the liturgical season called 'Ordinary Time', and the colour that marks this time is green. It is called 'Ordinary' not because there is nothing exciting going on in the Church until the beginning of Advent, but it is a time in which the Church lives and grows from the graces received during Easter and the colour green marks exactly that: the passing from the winter of sin and death into the spring of the Resurrection and New life given to us through the victory of Christ. Yet, especially if you come to Mass during the week, you may have noticed that rather than seeing green vestments, you were seeing red. The colour red is used for Palm Sunday and Good Friday Services, in which our focus is on Christ's shedding of his blood for our salvation. It is also used for Pentecost, red standing as a symbol for the fire of the Holy Spirit. But red is also used when the Church commemorates the Martyrs. Lately we had quite a few in succession: St. Alban, Ss. John Fisher and Thomas More, St. John Southworth, St. Irenaeus, Ss. Peter and Paul, The Protomartyrs of the Holy Roman Church, St. Thomas Apostle, St. Maria Goretti and many. We may know one or other thing about each of them, but what we all know for certain is that these were men and women who willing gave their life for Christ and for the faith. We sometimes may forget how many people gave their life to the point of shedding their blood so that we could know God, or celebrate the Eucharist and the other Sacraments. They are a real reminder that when we really love God and our neighbour we are ready to be hurt, as Mother Theresa reminds us: 'to love until it hurts'; the Saints are, on one hand, truly a reminder to us that that is how God love us: until it hurts by being rejected, abandoned, mocked, ignored, interrupted, betraved, crucified, buried. Yet all this does not stop God from loving us. On the other hand, the Saints are a proof that, in and through God, we can love like this: until it hurts.
