THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS

The visitor to our church cannot fail to be struck by the beautiful crucifix dominating the nave, which portrays Christ's body, crushed by suffering, overwhelmed by sorrow, the innocent victim whose death has reconciled us with the Father and given us a share in the very life of God. The Lord's outstretched arms seem to embrace this entire church, lifting up to the Father all the ranks of the faithful who gather around the altar of the Eucharistic sacrifice and share in its fruits. The crucified Lord stands above and before us as the source of our life and salvation, "the high priest of the good things to come", as the author of the Letter to the Hebrews calls him in today's first reading (Heb 9:11)."

Around this time of the year our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate Yom Kippur, when they believe God passes judgement on the world. It is no wonder that, at this time of the year the Church celebrates the Exaltation of the Cross, for on the Cross God passed judgement on the world: God, on the Cross, in his justice, condemned the world for its sins and the punishment was death for us. Yet on the Cross Christ, in his mercy, took upon himself our punishment, our death: he died, so that we might live; and so the verdict from the judgement upon the Cross was mercy for us, for Christ's death reconciled us with the Father, and the Resurrection is the guarantee that our death has been overcome. That is why the Cross became for us a source of life and salvation and it is in the Eucharist that we share in the life that God is giving us. God, through his death and resurrection offers us healing, forgiveness, life. Yet these gifts have to be accepted by us. Our 'NO' to sin is a 'Yes' to these gifts.

At the end of time there will be a final judgement: God will ask us: 'Did you accept my offer of love, forgiveness and life or not?' As we celebrate this feast of Christ's victory over sin and death through His Cross, let us say "yes" to God's offer, not only with our lips but also with our lives. Let our lives resonate the gift that in Eucharist we celebrate in mystery: to "share in the very life of God."
