Biblical meaning of Leprosy

Both the first reading and the Gospel speak of people who suffered with leprosy. Leprosy was the scourge of biblical times. Even in the Middle Ages it was considered so horrible that a person contaminated with it would have his funeral rites while still alive, before being banished, as afterwards the person would have to keep distant from others. It was so terrifying that the person was considered dead while still alive. That is how Moses prays for his sister Miriam when she is stricken by God with leprosy for speaking badly about Moses: 'Lord, do not let her be dead while still alive...'(Numbers 12:12).

In the bible leprosy becomes a symbol for sin. It is highly contagious, it deforms the person and brings death. It has the power to separate the person from others, bringing pain and isolation to the one who suffers from it and those around it. Because it was a bringer of death, only divine power could heal and bring life. The books of Leviticus and Deuteronomy have detailed elaborated rituals for dealing with leprosy, from the diagnostics to the cleansing and reinsertion among the people. The description is similar to that of making amendments for sin and forgiveness.

Both the first reading and gospel demonstrates though the power of God to bring healing, to bring these who because of their sickness were considered dead back to life; a reminder of the power of Jesus over our sin. No matter how small a sin is, it can hurt us and others...no matter how great a sin is, God can heal and forgive. Jesus came to bear our sorrows and carry our diseases, to be stricken for our sins (Isaiah 53: 4-5). We, the ones who can be sometimes the spiritual lepers need not be afraid to we come to him; he knows of our need of healing, forgiveness and belonging.
