Many people might know that CAFOD is the official aid agency for the Catholic Church in England and Wales. And that we make appeals twice a year, one at Lent and the other at Harvest. Our appeals highlight a cause we are helping to fund at the time and asks for your help. But there is much more to CAFOD and the work we do, starting with our vision to look after "our common home".

As Pope Francis says, Christus Vivit, #217: "In a word, to create a "home" is to create a "family". It is to learn to feel connected to others by more than merely utilitarian and practical bonds, to be united in such a way as to feel that our life is a bit more human. To create a home is to let prophecy take flesh and make our hours and days less cold, less indifferent and anonymous. It is to create bonds by simple, everyday acts that all of us can perform. A home, as well know, demands that everyone work together, No one can be indifferent or stand apart, since each is a stone needed to build the home."

We believe that if one of us is hurt, hungry or abandoned, we all are hurt, hungry and abandoned. And that no one should be beyond the love and support they need to live a dignified life. Working with one of the largest aid networks in the world, we have global reach and local presence in 165 countries. The local Church is trusted in even the most dangerous countries, regions and communities regardless of religion. So, through a local priest, a midwife or a water engineer – our global reach is present in the lived experience of local communities. These skilled women and men understand what people need because they are part of the communities they work in. Their commitment, passion and knowledge reach people other organisations can't. Our local experts can then help some of the most difficult-to-reach people in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Middle East. Whether it's a single mother living in a remote area, a teenage boy living in a war zone, or a disabled father and daughter who are discriminated against, we help anyone regardless of faith, gender and ethnicity. So, with your gifts, we can help those people living in hard-to-reach places and support those who are truly in need.

We will be holding short sessions in the parish hall later in the year, attended by CAFOD representatives, where you will have an opportunity to learn more about the causes we support and how your valuable donations really do make a difference. We look forward to welcoming you.
