Feast of the Ascension

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Iesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.' The disciples are standing there, watching Jesus leaving them, just when the pain of the crucifixion had barely started to heal in them by means of the event of the resurrection... What now? What will we do? Could He not remain with us? And just then their gaze is disturbed by the men in white, reminding them that their mission is starting. Helped by the Holy Spirit they were to be witnesses to what they have seen and experienced. Whatever Jesus gave them was not something that they were to keep for themselves. They were given a hope that was to be shared to all. In Jesus they saw the conquering power of God over sin and death, and in Jesus' Ascension they see the completion of God's plan for each one of us: to be in heaven forever. They carried out that mission wonderfully, giving their lives for the sake of the Good News they passed on. They saw that their true home was in heaven. True Christians are those who live with their eyes turned towards heaven, where, we, his members, might be confident of following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before (Preface for Ascension Sunday). Yet Christians contemplate heaven not in a static way, as the disciples were at first, but in action, as they carry their mission, helped by the Holy Spirit, of being witnesses to the victory accomplished by Jesus in his death and resurrection that they have experienced in their everyday lives. We experience this victory of Jesus over our sins, over our death especially when we approach the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. In confessing our sins we experience the love and mercy of Jesus Christ which breaks away from us the bonds that try to keep us enslaved to our selfish desires and by the words from Jesus, You are Forgiven', we experience the true freedom of the Children of God. In the Eucharist, we experience Heaven, where Jesus is; this same Jesus that Ascended to Heaven comes to us and we go to Him and Heaven and Earth meet and that has the power to make of us witnesses.
