Online registration is easy, it eliminates paper use, it helps to reduce errors and, in this time of pandemic. avoids paper handling. All parishioners, be they new or those who have been regular worshipers over many years, should register. If you are housebound or temporarily isolating at home, it is really important to register, so that we can keep in touch with you.

It would be good to complete the registration of church members before the end of this year. If you do not have a computer, you can pick up a form. when you are next in church. Thank you.

WHILST PUBLIC MASSES AND LITURGIES are FACTS AND FIGURES: the Annual Report of the Westminster Diocesan Trust is out now. You can read it on line at www.rcdow.org.uk/allabout-us The theme chosen for the Report: Lumen Christi, is very appropriate in view of the current pandemic. It is by the light of Christ that we continue to walk, even when all around us appears dark. The Diocese of Westminster is one of the smallest dioceses in England and Wales in geographical area, but the largest in terms of Catholic population and Priests. The Diocesan boundaries include the London boroughs north of the River Thames, between the River Lea to the east and the Borough of Hillingdon to the west, the County of Hertfordshire to the north and the Borough of Spelthorne in the south. Last year 136,000 people attended Mass each Sunday, in our 212 parish churches. Last year 90,000 students were educated in our 208 schools: and 870 social action projects were supported by some of the 40,000 volunteers who help in numerous ways in our churches week on week. Have a look at the report, it's interesting reading and if you happen to like numbers, pie charts and graphs - there is plenty to look at!

> PRECISION: the health and safety consultants, Precision, appointed by our Diocese, made their annual visit to inspect SJF buildings and to ensure we are health and safety compliant. They inspected our fire, safety and emergency provision, tested our electrical appliances and inspected our risk assessment documentation to ensure that everything is as it should be.

> The consultant commented in his report "...the standards of safety within your Parish are exceptionally high, and I thank you all for your hard work in achieving this" This is very good news indeed. Our thanks to parishioner, Keiron O'Shea who monitors our health and safety provision on a voluntary basis throughout the vear. Thank you Keiron for your dedicated work.

ADVENT BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY: In the Church, Advent is a period of preparation, extending over four Sundays, before the great celebration of the birth of Christ - Christmas. The word Advent comes from the Latin *advenio*. "to arrive." and refers to the coming of Christ. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; but second, to the coming of Christ in our lives, through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to his Second Coming at the end of time. Our preparations. therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily. The Agency for Evangelisation, have prepared some resources for us to use for Advent, whilst we are at home. They are available on our web sites. Paper copies are also available with this news sheet in church.
