

HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY "Samuel, Samuel!"

"Samuel, Samuel! "Here I am!"

What does it mean to be a follower of the Lord Jesus? Surely to listen and hear his voice, and to go where he leads us. Today, as we enter the ordinary season of the year, we begin our story of Jesus' life and ministry with the calling of the first disciples. John fulfils his ministry - pointing to the Lamb of God - and the disciples follow where he points. His word to them is simple and inviting: "Come and see." This echoes the calling of Samuel - a simple call, by name, which Samuel does not understand: discipleship is about trust, which Samuel shows simply by saying "Speak, Lord; your servant is listening." The Psalm also underlines this, as we (the disciples of the Lord) sing together: "Here I am, Lord ! I come to do your will." We hear his call, and we freely go to him, to listen again to the words of the Master. May the Lord continue to bless us on our journey of faith.

UPDATE ON THE LOCKDOWN AND THE CHURCH: For the time being, we are permitted to continue public Masses at SJF. We have high Covid positive rates in Shepperton at the moment and in common with other Catholic churches in our Deanery, some of our weekday Masses are now said privately. Please see the timetable for Holy Mass changes. All Mass intentions will be offered as usual, be that at the public Mass or when the Holy Mass is said in private. If you or a member of your household are vulnerable, clinically AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION compromised, or shielding, it is important that you do not come. Additionally, if you have a cough, even if you think its a common cold, Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all please remain at home until you are fit.

Thank you for wearing a face covering, they are compulsory in our buildings at all times - even outside of the Mass. There is an update regarding face coverings: a see through face visor or shield can be worn, but in addition to a face covering, not instead of one. This is because face visors or shields do not adequately cover the nose and mouth and therefore offer less protection for you and for others. Almost all of our children are wearing face coverings in SJF, this is brilliant thank you, but a reminder, if your child is 11 years old or over, a face covering must be worn, Thank you.

Last week, the seating configuration was changed to allow for more distance between worshippers. We are only permitting 3 parishioners per bench, unless a family /bubble are sitting together.

Holy Communion at home for the sick continues to be suspended, but the Sacrament for those who are close to dying (commonly called the Last Rites of the Church) will still be administered. If a parishioner is in hospital, the Catholic Hospital Chaplain can be advised via the nurses station on each ward. Parish clergy are not permitted to go on to the wards during the pandemic.

The celebration of Holy Baptism is currently suspended and First Holy Communion (FHC) Registration will not take place for the time being. Our young people, preparing for Holv Confirmation, are still, waiting to finish their course and to receive the Sacrament. When there is a clearer way to proceed, we'll let you know. There will be no registration for a new class for Holy Confirmation during 2021.

Many people are naturally feeling anxious at the moment about the spread of Covid. But we have hope, with the roll out of the two new vaccines. Please pray at home for an end to the spread of the virus and for the safe distribution of the vaccine. Please also pray for all who are in hospital and for those who are sick at home, who have tested positive, including members of the clergy across our Diocese. Thank you.

(For those not able to receive Holy Communion)

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.

PLEASE PRAY: for Lorna Troop RIP and for Reg Day RIP (and for their families), whose Funeral Masses will take place this coming week. If you hope to attend either Mass, it is important that you contact the respective families to let them know. This is because current Covid protocols only allow for up to 30 people to attend a funeral in church.

CHRISTIAN UNITY: From 18th-25th January, the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity takes place. Please pray for our brothers and sisters, in other Christian communities, especially those in Shepperton and the surrounding areas. We pray that one day we may be as one Church.
