HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY

"You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you"

It may seem strange, but this is a Christmas Feast. Not if we think of Christmas only in terms of the Baby in Bethlehem, but if we have followed the ideas of the Feasts of The Holy Family and especially Epiphany, and have seen the Season in terms of the growing manifestation or appearing of the Son of God: first to the shepherds and then to the wise men from the East. Now, in the River Jordan, Jesus, Son of Mary, is revealed to all as the fullness of all God's promises: "This is my Son, the Beloved". On this day we stand before the revelation of God's love for us, such, that he would send his only Son into the world. Christmas without the Baptism of the Lord, and the words that are spoken from heaven, would be incomplete, since it is only in them that we fully see the wonder of what happened in Bethlehem, that we fully understand the reason for the joy with which we celebrated Christmas Day. As we come to the end of The Christmas Season today, and look forward to hearing the Gospel in Ordinary Time, we do so having been shown who it is we listen to: the only Son of God, the Beloved.

weekday Masses will now be said privately. We updated details and are now listed correctly. will therefore be open for public Mass at 9.30am on Wednesday and Friday and for the usual Sunday Masses: Sat Vigil at 6.00pm and Sunday at 8.30am and 10.30am. This may be adjusted in the weeks ahead. All Mass intentions will be offered as usual, be that at the public Mass or when Mass is said in private (see back page).

The Holy Father has suspended the obligation to attend Mass during the pandemic, including Holy Days of Obligation. If you, or a member of your household are vulnerable, clinically compromised, or shielding, it is important that you do not come. It is also most important, that if you are unwell, even if it's just the common cold, that you remain at home and get better before attending Mass again. Thank you for wearing a face covering, they are compulsory in our buildings at all times - even outside of the Mass.

Holy Communion at home for the sick continues to be suspended for the time being. The Sacrament of the Sick. for those who are close to dying (commonly called the Last Rites of the Church) will still be administered. Please let me know if someone is very gravely ill, so they can receive the Sacraments. If a parishioner is in hospital, the Catholic Hospital Chaplain can be advised via the nurses station on each ward. Parish clergy are not permitted to go on to the wards during the pandemic.

Looking ahead: First Holy Communion (FHC) Registration will not take place for the time being. Whilst FHC children were finally able to finish their course and receive Holy Communion before Christmas, our young people preparing for Holy Confirmation, are still, waiting to finish the course and receive the Sacrament. When there is a clearer way to proceed, we'll let you know. There will be no registration for a new class for Holy Confirmation during 2021.


