HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY

"He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another."

HE CATHOLIC CHURCHOF ST JOHN FISHER

The world, as we know, is a fragile and fallible place, in which we encounter disease, sickness and death. We have seen this over the past year, more than at any other time in recent history.

Jesus proclaims, by his actions of healing, that there is another world, the Kingdom of God, which will be free from all such anxieties and afflictions. The story of Paradise and the Garden of Eden painted a picture of a world which was perfect, and free from all problems.

Jesus came into the world precisely to offer us a return to Eden, if we follow him. Each of his miracles is, in some sense, a parable or teaching pointing about the lost happiness and perfection, which he is restoring.

This vision of Paradise is not utopian or delusory, not just a vain hope to comfort us with, but the true manifestation of God's love for us. Jesus could not cure every disease or sickness in the world then: but his miracles of healing are a sign that one day, when the Kingdom comes, sickness and disease will be wiped away for ever.

ASH WEDNESDAY this year will, be rather different to previous years. The Vatican has issued special instructions regarding the distribution of ashes, mindful of the current health emergency. Instead of our foreheads being marked with ash, the priest will sprinkle the ash directly over your head. This is common practice APOLOGIES: our toilets and hall remain closed at already in some other countries. Ordinarily we would have a morning and evening Mass. However, as most people are working from home, we shall have two Masses, one at 9.30am and the other at 11.30am.

If you or a member of your household are vulnerable, clinically compromised, or shielding, it is important that you do not come. Additionally, if you have a cough, even if you think it's a common cold, please remain at home until you are fit.

Thank you for wearing your face covering, they are compulsory in our buildings at all times - even outside of the Mass. There is an update regarding face coverings: a see-through face visor or shield can be worn, but in addition to a face covering, not instead of one. This is because face visors or shields do not adequately cover the nose and mouth and therefore offer less protection for you and for others. Almost all of our children are wearing face coverings in SJF, this is brilliant thank you, but a reminder, if your child is 11 years old or over, a face covering must be worn in the church. Thank you.
