HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY

"Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up."

This week, on our journey through the Old Testament, we reach Covenant Number Three: and this is the big one - the Covenant with Moses at Sinai. The Ten Commandments are (or should be) familiar to us all: they form our side of the agreement with God - if we stick to these rules and commands, then we are truly God's people, and he is truly our God. If we ignore them, or break them, then we break the Covenant or relationship. The Temple was, for the people of Israel, the place that guaranteed the permanence of this Covenant - God dwelling with man. Jesus alerts us to the new Temple - himself - since he is the core of the New Covenant, God and Man in perfect unity. Only by the destruction of this new Temple, in his death, will he rise again as an eternal Temple, and the eternal guarantee of the New Covenant which we enjoy.

The broad detail has been worked out nationally through the Conference of Bishops, but each parish priest now needs to work out the details which are best for their buildings and congregations and in a Covid secure

We'll ensure the food donations get to our local food banks for distribution on a weekly basis. Thank you for checking that your donations are 'in date' before you drop them off. Thank you for helping those in need in our area.

> TREE TIME: over the coming weeks you'll notice that the trees which line the side of the church will be receiving some maintenance. Some will have to be removed to prevent damage to the wall, others will be pruned back. We are very grateful to the church member who has offered to make a donation to cover fifty per cent of the costs involved. This will help us enormously. We estimate the works will take a couple of days to complete.

POLLING: you will be pleased to hear that our church hall will be used as a Polling Station for the Elections in May. All the paperwork has been completed and this will generate some welcome income for the Church. It will be good to have the Polling Station back after many years away.

COVID ROADMAP FOR CHURCHES: If the four national tests have been satisfied for easing lockdown: From 8th March weddings with up to 6 people may resume. Funerals continue with a maximum of 30 attending. From 12th April: weddings with up to 15 people allowed. Funerals continue with a maximum of 30 attending. From 17th May: Holy Baptisms, weddings and funerals with up to 30 people attending are allowed. From 21st June: no restrictions on numbers providing restrictions are not re-imposed.
