HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY

"God sent his Son, so that through him the world might be saved"

There were two remarkable moments in the story of the Old Testament where God saved his people; one was in the escape from Egypt — we'll keep that for the Easter Vigil. The other was the end of their second exile, this time in Babylon, which we hear of today. Of course there was an even greater moment when God saved his people: the work of Jesus Christ, the Son of God — and we hear Jesus tell Nicodemus about that today. So today's theme is "salvation": but to understand "being saved", we must ask "What from?" Saved from slavery, from exile, from human enemies — these are all clear. But the last and greatest salvation brought by Jesus is harder to understand: saved from sin and death. These threaten us as much as any other enemy, and our salvation in Jesus is as real as any other.

THE EASTER VIGIL: begins at the earlier time of 7.00pm The Lucernarium, (Holy Fire, Blessing of the Paschal Candle) and procession into church will be omitted and the Liturgy of the Word abbreviated. Precise details are still being worked out. EASTER SUNDAY Masses will be as usual at 8.30am and 10.30am including the Renewal of Baptismal Promises. The usual Covid restrictions will remain in place.

> IT'S BY THE ENTRANCE: if you make your weekly offering using the new card reader — for your convenience, the reader is now sited on the wall, in the entrance area of the church. The green collection bucket for cash offerings and envelopes will remain by the car park exit for the time being. Thank you for support SJF.

> FOOD BANK BOX: SJF now has an all year round Food Bank deposit box, situated in the church entrance porch. We'll ensure the food donations get to our local food banks for distribution on a weekly basis. Thank you for checking that your donations are 'in date' before you drop them off.

> **HOLY MASS:** currently there is no singing at Mass and to minimise time spent inside, certain other elements are omitted, including the Prayer of the Faithful, the intercessions. Whilst the priest prepares the gifts at the altar, you might think of your own prayers for the Church and the world, and for your own particular intentions for this Mass.

> COVID ROADMAP FOR CHURCHES: If the four national tests have been satisfied for easing lockdown: From 8th March weddings with up to 6 people may resume. Funerals continue with a maximum of 30 attending. From 12th April: weddings with up to 15 people allowed. Funerals continue with a maximum of 30 attending. From 17th May: Holy Baptisms, weddings and funerals with up to 30 people attending are allowed. From 21st June: no restrictions on numbers providing restrictions are not re-imposed.
