

## **HOLY MASS THIS SUNDAY**

"The Good Shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep."



# HE CATHOLIC CHURCH OF ST JOHN FISHER



THIS SUNDAY is traditionally called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because of the Gospel narratives (from St John, chapter 10) read each year, in which Jesus talks of himself as the Good Shepherd, who lays down his life for his flock. A general theme to the scriptures is the person of Jesus and what he has achieved by the Paschal Mystery (his dying and rising). The first reading talks of his name, and the power of the name of Jesus to save. One of the results of the "power of his name" is that in him we are all God's children and are promised an eternal reward. All this is summed up in the Gospel, in which Jesus talks of himself as the real shepherd, who is prepared to do anything for his flock, even to the point of giving his life. Jesus said this before his Passion, but in Eastertide we read it with the benefit of hindsight. His words are true and by his dying and rising, he has truly saved his flock.

Alleluia! Alleluia!

# You may have seen on TV a

You may have seen on TV, a shepherd in the fields, with his dog running round in answer to his whistles, chasing the sheep into their places. This is NOT the sort of shepherd Jesus says he is today! Back in Jesus' day, hundreds of years ago, the shepherd actually lived with a flock of sheep (remember the shepherds of Bethlehem, when Jesus was born?), and when they were on the move the shepherd walked first, at the head of the flock. The sheep all followed him. This was so that the shepherd could look out for any danger (like wolves!) and protect the sheep. But this meant that a lazy or silly sheep could wander off and the shepherd would have to stop and find it again. So Jesus as our Good Shepherd doesn't stand still, whistling at dogs, but walk in front of us in life, facing the things we will face, and asking us to stay close and follow him!

Today is called Vocations Sunday. A "vocation" is a call from God to do some special work — like being a priest or a nun. Have you thought about what you want to be when you grow up?

WELCOME TO SJF: You may have noticed that a SEMINARY: Allen Hall in Chelsea is our local Masses are becoming busy again, but the Sunday here: Vigil Mass, on Saturday evening at 6.00pm still has plenty of space.
