

Sunday 2nd May 2021 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER



Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another (agricultural) image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. This is the period of Mystagogy, when the newly Baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the three readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ. It is not simply enough to "belong" to Jesus: our belonging must be shown by the works we do and by the fruits we bear - while remembering that we cannot produce fruit, except in him.

LITTLE CHURCH - FOR OUR YOUNGSTERS

Have you ever seen a vine, where grapes come from? If not, you might have helped to looked after some plants? You perhaps already know, that they need water and sunlight to grow. They also need the dead leaves or branches to be trimmed, to let good ones grow. This is what Jesus is telling us in today's Gospel – that all together we are like a plant in him.

Each of us is like a leaf or branch that is part of the big plant! God the Father looks after this plant (which we could also call the Church family): anyone who gets "cut off" from this plant won't be able to grow – this happens when we ignore or say "no" to God. So we should make sure we stay "connected to Jesus." How do we do this? By thinking about Jesus, by praying quietly every day, by doing good things in Jesus' name, by being God's children in what we think, what we say and what we do.

ANNUAL MASS OF THANKSGIVING FOR THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY MATRIMONY, via livestream from Westminster Cathedral, on Saturday 15th May at 3.00pm. The Cardinal will be celebrating a live-streamed Mass for all couples in the Diocese who are celebrating their 5th, 10th, 25th, 30th, 40th, 50th and 60th (and every year over 60) wedding anniversary of Catholic marriage in 2021. SIGNIFICANT CHANGES to the Registration of Marriages come into force in May. These changes are the biggest since 1837. From 4th May Marriage Certificates will only be issued by our Local Registration Office and not by the Parish Priest or other authorised persons. We will also be required to return all but one of our Marriage Registers to the Registration Office. We will no longer issue copies of Marriage Certificates for past marriages here either. This means that the couple will no longer sign the Marriage Register at the time of the wedding, neither will the Priest or the witnesses sign it. Instead, the couple will supply a 'Marriage Schedule', in advance of the wedding. This will be a single form and it is this, which will need to be signed by the couple, the authorised person and the witnesses at the time of the wedding. Once signed, the Priest or other authorised person will return the form to the Registration Office. The Registration Office will then issue the Marriage Certificate. The marriage ceremony itself does not change and the consent to marriage, made by the couple, does not change either.
