

In some ways the most surprising moment in this week's Gospel is the image of Jesus, fast asleep on a cushion in the midst of a sudden and terrifying storm! His calm in the midst of chaos seems almost too dramatic! But this is the point of the story, emphasized by his words to the others in the boat, when he asks "How is it that you have no faith?" Faith is not about the lovely pleasure boat ride on the sunny peaceful lake, but clinging to the gunwales (the planking on the side of a boat), in the terror of a storm. We interpret this as symbolic of the journey of our lives, which can be rent by sudden storms — tragedy, loss, anxiety, illness: we have to hear the voice of Jesus, who is in the boat with us, who shares anxiety and loss with us, so that he can say to us "Quiet now! Be calm!"

LITTLE CHURCH - FOR OUR YOUNGSTERS:

Can you remember a time when you were worried about something, perhaps about a test at school, or something that happened to a friend, or a news story on TV? Who do you talk to when you feel sad? When we talk to our friends, parents, brothers and sisters, it helps because we know we are not alone.



The friends of Jesus today were worried about the storm, but Jesus wasn't worried, he kept on sleeping— until he calmed the storm! Like the disciples, we can share our worries and concerns with Jesus. Jesus can help us see our worries from a different perspective. He can help us face our worries with faith in his love and protection for us. Think about one thing you are concerned about today and say a prayer to Jesus about it. Remember that he is your friend and will always be with you.
