READINGS AT THE HOLY MASS TODAY:

First Reading: Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab In this vision from the Book of Revelation, we are presented with a woman dressed like a queen DIARY DATE FOR EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS with a crown of twelve stars. The stars represent OF HOLY COMMUNION: Training and the twelve tribes of Israel, the nation that gave commissioning of existing ministers and those birth to the Messiah. A wild red dragon (evil) tries to destroy the woman's newborn son (the ministers - assisting Fr Shaun at Mass in the Messiah). But God dramatically saves the child by distribution of Holy Communion and/or taking "snatching him up" to heaven.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-27

Christ is risen! He was the first to experience the joy of resurrection. But he is not the last. All of us will also rise from the dead. At the second coming, Jesus will "hand over the kingdom to God" and we will share in his final victory. Mary did not have to wait for the end of time to rise from the dead. Now she waits, to welcome each of us to our eternal home.

Gospel: Luke 1:39-56

St Luke tells us the beautiful story of Mary sharing with Elizabeth the news of her pregnancy. Elizabeth immediately recognizes that Mary is "the mother of my Lord" and she praises Mary's complete faith in God's word. Bursting with joy, Mary sings her victory song, the Magnificat: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord."

WASN'T IT RED? If you have good eyesight, you will have noticed that the Red Blessed Sacrament Lamp is now clear/white. This is simply so that it may be seen more clearly and the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, be more evident. The liturgical norms suggest either a white or red lamp may be used.
