ST JOHN FISHER ATHOLIC CHURCH

After our brief excursion last week into Saint John's Gospel, we are back on track this week with Saint Luke - who we will follow for the rest of the year. Today is about beginnings: the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It begins with the Word of God, in the synagogue. Jesus reads from the Old Testament, as we do every Sunday, and tells the people that it is fulfilled in him. Everything that God has said to his people, through his prophets, comes together in Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God. Today is an ideal time to think about reading the Holy Scriptures in a new way. A Divine way. Try out this new, Divine way of reading the Holy Bible, you might be surprised by the results:

LECTIO DIVINA - DIVINE READING

Find a little time to be by yourself. Start by placing yourself in the presence of God by asking the Holy Spirit to open your mind.

Lectio: Read a scripture passage. Read it again, more slowly, noticing any word or phrase which stands out. Read it again if necessary.

Meditatio: Think about the word or phrase which stood out. If helpful, write your thoughts down.

Oratio: Listen to God. Is there a reason this word or phrase is significant to me right now? What emotions am I feeling?

Contemplatio: Is God calling me to do something? To be patient? To action in my community? To forgive someone? To ask for forgiveness? Now make a commitment to act on your contemplation.

Finish by thanking God for this time spent in prayer. Or close with a traditional prayer, such as an Our Father or a Glory Be.
