There is a lot of conflict in our world. Sometimes when we think of enemies we think of another country waging war with us or people who might try to attack us, such as terrorists. But the concept of enemies goes so much further than that. We hear about culture wars these days. People on opposite sides of an issue, want to win so badly, that they attack those who don't agree with them. They don't attack with weapons, but they attack with words and by using facts selectively. But enemies can also be even closer, it can be someone who gossips about us. An enemy can be a former friend who has betrayed us. And these enemies are often the ones who cause us the most pain because they are so close.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus invites us to love our enemies. This includes enemies who are far, far away, and enemies who we know by name.

The command to "love your enemies" seems almost impossible. Our hearts can become hard, because we don't want to be hurt again. Our hearts can become vengeful, because we want people to feel the same pain they caused us. How can we love? The key seems to be in the last part of the Gospel reading: "Stop judging and you will not be judged."

Jesus calls us to a change of heart, which is not easy. Jesus reminds us that we are also in need of mercy and forgiveness. Our hardened hearts need to become open and loving hearts, forgiving hearts. A change of heart takes some work. It is very difficult to love our enemies. It doesn't just happen. A starting point is to pray for those who hurt us and ask God for the grace to forgive.

ST RICHARD REYNOLDS CATHOLIC COLLEGE SRRCC - VOLUNTEER READERS AND SCRIBES

We know that the presence of a reader and scribe can make a huge difference to a pupil sitting their exams and we are seeking volunteers for this very rewarding role. You will experience first-hand the difference you can make to a pupil simply by being there. There is official guidance on the role of a reader/scribe and full training would be given. We understand that this could be a considerable time commitment as the exams take place over a 3-4 week period. A pupil does not have an exam every day but being a consistent adult is beneficial so we would like the same scribe to be with the same pupil each time.

The GCSE exams will take place:- From the 16th May to the 28th June usually from 9.00am up to 12.00pm and from 1.30pm up to 4.30pm.
