

Divine Office Psalter Week 4



ST JOHN FISHER ATHOLIC CHURCH

The readings for the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C tell us that our words and actions should reflect that we are Christians. The first reading tells us to be careful in our speech. The psalm reminds us to be just and kind. In the second reading, Paul tells us that Jesus Christ has given us victory over sin. In the gospel Jesus tells us to take care of our own sins before pointing out the failings of others, and that our words and actions reflect what is truly in our hearts.

What we say, reflects what we really believe deep down. And what we believe deep down, can impact our relationships with others. We can be blinded by our own pride, thinking we are better than those around us. We can become hypocrites, unaware of our own weaknesses. This is a barrier to our own path to holiness and prevents us from leading others to Christ.

Some things to ponder...

- Am I aware of my own blind spots?
- What am I afraid to see in my own life?
- Do my words build up the Kingdom of God or do they tear it down?

ASH WEDNESDAY IS THIS COMING WEEK. 2nd March and marks the beginning of Lent. It is a day of fasting and abstinence. Masses with the imposition of ashes for all who wish, are at 9.30am & 7.00pm. We receive the ashes on our heads with a sense of sorrow for our shortcomings, but also with a sense of hope. that forward to welcoming you to Holy Mass.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE INFORMATION: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics, in addition to the usual Fridays, when we abstain from meat. For us members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from the age of 18 until the age of 60 (unless you have a medical condition). When fasting, a person may eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals, that together are not equal to a full meal. Liquid, for example water, may be taken at any time. Abstinence from meat on these days is binding on those over 14 years old.
