



The readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent, remind us that God sees us in our weakness and suffering and saves us. The first reading tells us not to look at the past, but to see that a new way is possible. The psalm tells of sorrow turning to joy. In the second reading St Paul explains that we must let go of what we valued, to pursue life in Christ. And in the Gospel, Jesus confronts the crowd who are about to stone the woman, caught in adultery.

These readings call us to change our hearts. We might think our virtue and the Law of God empower us to judge others who don't seem to be getting it right. But in the Gospel, Jesus shows us another way. The woman did indeed break the rules. There is no denial of that. And there is no talk of the circumstances or why she did it. But Jesus believes in second chances, even when the Law does not offer them.

Both the crowd and the woman have strayed from the heart of God and his Law. We often do the same. Like the woman caught in adultery, we might ignore God's commands and do as we please. Or like the crowd, we might use the Law to draw a line between "us" and "them", desiring punishment and suffering for those who don't measure up.

WE ARE BLESSED with a small but dedicated team of volunteers who lovingly clean our church. It is dispiriting for them to have to clean away gum which has been chewed during the Holy Mass and stuck under the benches. This is horrible for other parishioners, sitting in these spaces and is discourteous. Please, care for your church, and help those, who voluntarily keep this holy place clean.

CONGRATULATIONS if you are hoping to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, either here or elsewhere, in the near future. The diocese requires six months notice for pastoral and administrative paperwork to be completed. Clergy deal with large amounts of paperwork for couples, so it is important that proper notice is given. Please note that if you are intending to marry abroad, many countries require Catholics to have received all three Initiation Sacraments before agreeing to marry. i.e. Baptism, First Holy preparation courses are mandatory for Catholic marriage and courses are run throughout the diocese.
