# God gave Israel the Law so it could serve as an example of how to live. However as Jewish society changed from a collective of small farms to a more urban based culture, some of the laws were difficult to interpret and apply.

Many teachers and scholars placed emphasis on purity laws which did not require a farming society to carry out. But others asked what the laws really meant. So it would not be unusual for someone to question which law was the most important. And Jesus answered. Love God. Love your neighbour as yourself. But the lawyer who asks the question offers a challenge, and Jesus replies with the parable of the Good Samaritan.

Samaritans were despised outsiders. They did not follow the law of Moses



as the Jews did. Jesus turns the tables by offering one of this group as a person who is truly doing God's will. The law is meant to form us into people who truly care about each other. We can't just ignore the pain of those around us.

It is also interesting to note that the Samaritans did not always welcome Jesus either. Just one chapter earlier he was turned away by them. (Luke 9:51-56). But Jesus does not hold a grudge. He makes the Samaritan the hero of this parable anyway.
