WE DON'T NEED TO BE SCARED - WE NEED TO BE PREPARED

The readings for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time might well cause us to think about the end of the world. In the first reading, we are told that the day of the Lord is coming. The psalm assures us that "The Lord comes to rule the earth with fairness." In the second reading, Paul asks that we diligently work for the good of all. In the gospel Jesus speaks about the end times and perseverance.



Jesus tells us that the end is coming. And when it does, we will be judged. There are some criteria for this judgement. The gospel calls us to be faithful - to be prepared. This is not always easy, and it will bring trials and suffering from worldly powers. In fact, we don't need to wait for the end times, to experience this. Even today, being Catholic is often met with scorn and ridicule.



So while none of us wants to suffer, and we certainly shouldn't seek out persecution, we will experience pain in our lives. Some pain will be a result of living our faith, but this is our mission as Christians. Jesus assures us that we will be saved. So we don't need to be scared - we just need to be prepared! ahead.
