First Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14

When the Lord says: "I am going to open your graves," these words really are addressed to us, no matter how chilling they may sound. This is the promise of the resurrection we will explore at Easter, that just as Jesus died and rose again, so, because we are baptised in him, we will die and rise again. This is the doctrine of the Resurrection of the Body which we proclaim in the Creed. So in reading, do not stumble over those words of God: allow them to ring out confidently each time they occur. The promise of life from the grave is our greatest Christian hope.

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-11

Saint Paul teaches that those who live according to the flesh cannot please God, but those who live according to the Spirit have the Spirit of Christ within them and will have life. Paul declares that the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead, dwells within believers and gives life to their mortal bodies.

Gospel: John 11:1-45

I am the resurrection and the life: this statement by Jesus is at the centre of the Gospel of 'the raising of Lazarus'. To believe in Jesus, Messiah and Son of God, is already to have within oneself eternal life, which death cannot destroy.

THE VEILING OF IMAGES & STATUES IN CHURCH

There is a significant change in the appearance of our church, from the 5th Sunday of Lent. The statues are now veiled and remain covered until the First Mass of Easter. Only the Stations of the Cross remain visible, for devotion. The veiling, with purple material makes us stop and ask - Why this emptiness? Why this sombre purple? The purpose of veiling is to help us to refocus, to create a wilderness in our lives which is free from distractions, even just for an hour at Mass. In this brief wilderness, we pray that we may discover a closeness with God, more vividly, more strongly and more perfectly than before.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS are a lovely Lenten tradition. In this devotion, we make the journey to Calvary with our Lord Jesus, focusing on how he suffered for us and his interactions with those he met on the way. The Stations are in church on Fridays during Lent at 7.00pm. If you are looking for something different to do this Lent, come and join us in this quiet meditative encounter with the Lord.
