alleviate suffering, and to remind the Israelites that they had also suffered and that God had rescued them. Jesus points out that the many laws were all contained in "Love God" and "Love your neighbour." This is the point of these precepts. The word used for love is "agape" which is more than just a feeling of friendship or affection. It is a love committed to action.

Both passages remind us that our ethical and spiritual responsibilities are interconnected. Loving God is closely tied to how we treat others. So we are also called to love the marginalized in our world. And we must not just love them by thinking well of them. We are called to action!

The readings for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time emphasise the imperative to love and show compassion to others, especially those who are vulnerable or marginalized. In the Book of Exodus, God instructs the Israelites not to mistreat foreigners, widows, or orphans and to lend to those in need, without interest. In the Gospel of St Matthew, Jesus sums up the Law with the two greatest commandments: love God and love your neighbour.

The laws which God gave to Israel were meant to protect the vulnerable. They were meant to
