

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - A Requiem Mass for the War Dead will be celebrated on Sunday 12th Nov at 10.30am. A two minute silence will be kept at the end of the intercessory prayers, ROYAL BRITISH LEGION POPPIES are now available at the back of church, for a donation to this honourable cause. We thank Bernard Troop who has organised these again for us this year.

SEVEN DAY MEMORIAL CANDLES are available for £5, on which to add the names of your loved ones. These candles will burn during the whole month of November, in the church to the left of the lectern. Pick up a names label from the Repository shop by the church entrance, to complete and return to the office or sacristy.

BE PREPARED: So often in the holy scriptures we are told to be prepared. During November we remember those who have died, but this is also a good time to prepare or update our own affairs. Many people use this month to make or to revisit their Will and to leave written instructions of their funeral wishes. This is an opportunity to be prepared, to make a note of favourite hymns and bible readings and to consider the type of funeral service you would like, be it a Mass or a Liturgy of the Word, burial or cremation. It is important to remember that secular music and poems are not permissible at services in Catholics Churches. This is not the Catholic Church being difficult, but ensuring that the Words of God contained in the Holy Bible and sacred music and hymns always take precedence. Preparing our affairs is not a morbid thing to do, it's a loving act which takes them. In the meantime, It would be helpful if we


