In the first reading, Abraham is called by God to an act of great trust and he obeys. He does not know what lies ahead, but he walks in faith. We

must also walk in faith, especially during our Lenten journey.

"Lent is not something we do for God – Lent is something we do with God."



In the Gospel Mark gives us an account of the Transfiguration of the Lord, when Peter, James and John also encounter God. They experience the divine presence in the transformed Jesus Christ. and his clothes which became "dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them" and the Lord spoke with Moses and Elijah.

The Transfiguration of the Lord also foreshadows his Resurrection. In his appearance to Mary of Magdala at the tomb, Jesus also had bright white clothes. Clearly something was significantly different about his appearance, for Mary not to recognize him
