This week the Votive Lamp in the Lady Chapel is lit in
prayer for the intentions of Lourdes.

The mystery of the Trinity is the greatest in our Christian faith! Before such a mystery, it is all too easy for us to find ourselves helpless, because the one whom we cannot comprehend, is God, who has absolute power over us and on whom we depend, for our well-being. Each time that we try to understand the dynamism of the Trinity, we can so easily become perplexed and confused because we are entering into the inner life of God. In trying to understand this mystery, it is good to remember that mysteries are not meant to be understood, but to be lived with admiration and hope, and our attitude should be that of respect and fear.

The Bible does not explain the mystery of the Trinity, but glimpses of its nature come to us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus himself says that the one who has seen him has seen the Father and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom he chooses to reveal himself. Jesus has revealed God as one, but he is not alone; God is a community of three persons in a harmonious relationship. God's unconditional love for us is the Good News, it is the Good News of God the Father, the Good News of Jesus Christ the Son, the Good News of the Holy Spirit, it is the Good News of the Most Holy Trinity.
