Could you be a priest?

This weekend is known as 'Good Shepherd Sunday' when the Church encourages its members to consider whether you or someone you known might have a vocation to serve the Church as a priest. Now, this may or may not be an idea that appeals to you – but at the very least it is worth considering.

Everyone has a vocation – everyone is called by God to some definite service, and no one is exempt from this. I think every one of us should ask ourselves what that definite service might be – God has a purpose for us, a purpose that is not just about our own well-being and happiness, but about the good of others. So, when considering our path in life, our future career, our choices, our expectations, we need to look at the bigger picture of how we can contribute to those around us – to the common good.

For some, this God-given vocation could well be to serve as priest. Now, you might have all sorts of reasons for feeling this is not for you (or your child), but most of those reasons are just excuses. Basically, unless you are married or a woman (and yes, I agree it's not fair either) the possibility of a vocation to the priesthood is something you should give serious consideration to. Being a priest is way of seriously making a difference, it's most definitely not boring (unless you don't like people, and it requires people of all backgrounds, outlooks, and personality types. You don't need to 'holy', at least not in the common sense of the word. You also don't need to be some kind of saint!

So, please consider whether you or your friend or family member might have a calling to the priesthood. God tends not to give you some sort of vision or divine voice, but more often you experience the call through the suggestion of others "Have you thought about being a priest?" or through the workings of our own hearts and minds, 'maybe I could do this'. If you've got a toddler, you are welcome to bring toys to distract them. It's a good idea to bring things that can't be used to make a noise. Best of all, come and sit at the front where they can see!

We appreciate that every child is different and that bringing children to Mass is not always easy. If you are finding it particularly hard today, be assured that you are not alone.

First Holy Communion 2024 – and 2025! Current group 2024

Our First Holy Communion preparation is now in its last couple of months. On Saturday 27th April, 13.00 –16.00 we have our final children's workshop, then rehearsals on 17th May, followed by First Holy Communion on Saturday 18th May. The final event is the thanksgiving Mass, procession and breakfast on Sunday 9th June.

Next year's group 2025

Next year in 2025, First Holy Communion will be on Saturday 17th May – registration for this will take place in September this year, and is open to children who will be (in September) in school Year 3 or above. Preparation starts in the winter and is done in the parish, and is open to all parish children no matter what school they attend. If your child does not attend a Catholic school, they will also need to go to the 'Footsteps' pre-course, which takes place over six Wednesday after-school sessions in the autumn. Full details of everything will be available in du course. Manna Food Bank

You are invited to drop items of non-perishable food **in the church when open** to support our local foodbank. The foodbank table is in the porch, between the hall and church doors. Food/drink should be non-perishable, so there should be nothing that requires refrigeration, nor fresh cakes or bread. Items should be unopened and unused. Items should not be donated after their 'best before' date. This might sound fussy, but any of us could end up relying on a food bank, so a certain level of quality control is important.

Lego Club

Our Lego Club now operates at selected Masses, where a 'Lego Chief' is present to supervise. This room is restricted to children of primary and secondary school age (not pre-school), and their parents/carers and we ask that the Lego is treated with care, not dropped on the floor, and not removed from the room. If the door is closed – the Lego Club is NOT open, but if the door is open and a Lego Chief (a specially trained teenager) is present, the Lego Club is open. Parents/carers must be present in the hall while the child is playing Lego and retain responsibility for the safety of their child at all times. The 'Lego Chief' is there to protect the Lego, not your child!

Going to Hospital?

In light of data protection please indicate on entering hospital that your details are to be passed to the Catholic Chaplain **and** please ask the Catholic Chaplain to visit you.

Fire safety

In case of fire, you will be invited to leave the building. Use the nearest exit and go home. Don't move your vehicle from the car park as this will slow things down. If you need to await family or others, wait at the assembly point in front of the garage. Do not re-enter the building until advised to do so.
