Onwards and upwards

This Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord. As this is a Holyday of Obligation, Mass will be celebrated at 07.00, 09.30 and 19.00 followed by refreshments as appropriate to the time of day.

The Feast of the Ascension marks the day when forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus was taken up to heaven. During the those forty days, Jesus visited his disciples and helped them to realise that he was alive, that he had forgiven them, and that, despite the events of Holy week, it was very much 'game on' for them. Before he ascended, he told his disciples to 'go and make disciples of all nations', but first to hang on for the promised coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Like the disciples, we too are called to make disciples of all nations and we have also been promised the Holy Spirit. The Ascension is where we let go of Jesus being with us in one way, so that we can experience his power is an even more exciting way. As the Easter season draws to a close for us, it does so with a bang rather than a whimper.

If you have a baby you are welcome to feed/breastfeed your child at any time and in any place you feel most comfortable. You can go into the hall or simply remain in your place in church.

If you've got a toddler, you are welcome to bring toys to distract them. It's a good idea to bring things that can't be used to make a noise. Best of all, come and sit at the front where they can see!

We appreciate that every child is different and that bringing children to Mass is not always easy. If you are finding it particularly hard today, be assured that you are not alone.

If you have an unbaptised baby (or are half expecting one), please introduce yourself & your child, either after Mass or over the phone, and we can talk about next steps.

First Holy Communion 2025

Next year in 2025, First Holy Communion will be on Saturday 17th May – registration for this will take place in September this year, and is open to children who will be (in September) in school Year 3 or above. Preparation starts in the winter and is done in the parish, and is open to all parish children no matter what school they attend. If your child does not attend a Catholic school, they will also need to go to the 'Footsteps' pre-course, which takes place over five Wednesday after-school sessions in the autumn. Meanwhile, please let your friends (who maybe don't go to Mass so often) know about the programme and explain that they might want to start showing their faces here now! Registration is NOT open yet, but a dates and details sheet is available in the porch, so you know what you are committing too in advance!

Manna Food Bank

You are invited to drop items of non-perishable food **in the church when open** to support our local foodbank. The foodbank table is in the porch, between the hall and church doors. Food/drink should be non-perishable, so there should be nothing that requires refrigeration, nor fresh cakes or bread. Items should be unopened and unused. Items should not be donated after their 'best before' date. This might sound fussy, but any of us could end up relying on a food bank, so a certain level of quality control is important.
