# 2 Update on Parish Events held (plus any learnings) and being planned-

- 1) Anniversary Event 16.10 with St Adrian's School-See Youth Group update for outline of the event. Additional information given included that Canon Plourde will lead the procession and the 10.30 mass for this occasion, the Headteacher of St Adrian's would issue notice of the procession and ask for confirming RSVP for families who would be attending. The Chairman confirmed the overall budget would be up to £300. Tea/coffee as usual after 10.30 hrs mass. No return to school.

  - a. Prayer cards were made available for all and parishioners encouraged to

- b. join with the novena.
- 3) **Cake-Bake on 14/8** Funds raised for key interior elements of St Boniface Church in Ghana-See Building Community update.
- 4) Flower Fund and Flower Festival Update-A very happy afternoon with impressive floral arrangements, jolly tea, background accompaniment of harp and violin which raised £1500:00. The funds raised will go towards funding of our church flowers, St Boniface church project and 2023HCPT pilgrimage.

The Chairman informed the Council that Parish Finance Committee was considering a proposal for managing the church flowers budget suggesting a 6 month trial of the suggested process for 6 months from 01/09/22.

# 3 Planning Quarter 4 2022 and into 2023-

# 4.1 Synodal Pathway-

Teresa Clarke updated that a Diocese release of an information resource was the next step for parishes under the Synodal Pathway. This resource was entitled *The journey we share and comprised of* 5 sessions exploring the emerging themes of the Synodal pathway. At this stage Teresa has ordered I copy to be available for As we do not yet know the content and its suitability.

## 4.2 Advent/Christmas 2022-

Building on from initiatives which had worked well last year, it was agreed that, subject to Fr Francis's agreement, our liturgical focus for this period of the Churches' year could include:

- 1. Opportunity to all to participate in Advent Ecumenical groups
- 2. Opportunity for our young people to participate in a Christingle Service
- 3. A Candlemas Service

### Actions:

- 1. Advent Ecumenical Groups arrangements for St Barts parishioners led by our Ecumenical Group
- 2. Christingle Service arrangements led by our Youth Group
- 3. Candlemas Service arrangements led by our Spirituality Group and Fr Francis

## 4.3 Social Justice -

There was discussion on any action St Barts could take to help parishioners with the impact of the cost of living on our parishioners which is hitting us all now. This led to considering a simple parish Harvest festival on the weekend of the 22 and 23.10 where families bring an item. This may be able to link with the St Adrian's Harvest festival being held on Thursday 20.10. This would be subject to Fr Francis' approval of the liturgy for that date.

The discussion then moved to a longer term support by the provision of a food and toiletries box in the Church porch which should be available both for immediate parishioners and to help others locally. It was suggested that the Sopwell Community Foodbank was the channel to help people locally.

### Actions:

Need Fr Francis's approval re Harvest Festival on 22- 23 October. Await his feedback from these Minutes and follow up in early October 2022 with him if no feedback.

# 4 Asylum Seekers - update and next steps

Teresa Clarke 's update included the key points below:

- 1. The conversation group started in February at Greenwood URC, and the St Barts group started in April. Our work has developed into sourcing bikes, bike training, Daisy Cooper's support for asylum applications, finding Legal Aid solicitors, supporting the asylum seekers to enrol at Oaklands for ESOL courses, queries with bus passes, football training, a multicultural meal that they prepared and much more! We have good links with the Cathedral conversation group. The St Albans Masorti Synagogue will prepare a meal for them in November, and the asylum seekers will help with the Mitzvah community volunteering day. The Cathedral is holding an exhibition in January called "In a Strange Land", telling stories from asylum seekers and taking their photographs.
- Teresa is speaking at the Westminster Social Justice and Peace Forum on 17 September explaining our work with asylum seekers in St Albans. The zoom link is

- 3. There are now 150 asylum seekers residing at The Noke.
- 4. One of the successes in supporting the asylum seekers has been the bicycle recycling initiative. The Harpenden recycling centre is currently selling bikes for £20-30.

**Agreed**: PPC would support an application to the Parish Finance Committee for £200 for the purpose of purchase of further bicycles. Chair to speak to Fr Francis and Finance.

### Action:

Emma will make inquiry with Garston recycling centre as to their process for passing on bicycles.

## 5 Maintenance Team Update

- 1. Replacement fencing and gate installation in Fr Francis' Garden and installation of a fire safety door in the hall kitchen were now completed.
- 2. A request for a baby change facility in the cloakroom in the church porch was being considered.
- 3. An offer has been made to donate a Bench for placing outside the front of the church (near the railings). The response voiced by those present was of concern that this may become a generally used bench for congregating rather than for the benefit of parishioners. Further, if the PPC at the October meeting agree to proceed with the prayer garden proposal and the proposal is then supported by the Parish, would the donor agree to bench being placed within the prayer garden?

Natalie set up our Facebook page as well as designed many posters and comms for us so really has helped to raise awareness of the new PPC.
