



Dear New St Barts Parishioner,

Welcome to St Barts! We are delighted that you have come to participate in our worship today and we sincerely wish you a warm and friendly welcome here among us at St Barts.

Our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) comprises of a team of 12 volunteers nominated by parishioners who work alongside a sizeable number of parishioners. The PPC was established in October 2020. It is a consultative body whose main aim is to support our Parish Priest, Fr Francis, as well as the whole parish community of St Barts, in considering pastoral and other works of interest to our parishioners. In collaboration with all parish groups, we support agreed activities to foster our community spirit and enable the delivery of our Mission, Evangelisation. A key element of the PPC is to consider ways to provide opportunities for our parishioners to discover, or re-discover, the personal and community call to the mission that derives from their baptism and to sustain their efforts to live as Catholics.

The five focus areas for St Barts are: Spirituality, Building Community, Youth, Ecumenism, and Social Justice. We believe that through coming together, socialising, exchanging ideas and learning that we will develop our understanding of our own faith and build confidence in our ability to share the Good News. We have a wide range of parish groups who are working to enhance our parish life as well as external outreach activities. 

ST BART'S CHILDREN'S LITURGY

All our children up to year 2 (before receiving their First Holy Communion) are invited to join our Sunday Children's Liturgy. Our Liturgy of the Word for children runs during termtime Sunday morning masses at 10.30am. The children are called forward at the start of Mass (those under 5 should be accompanied by a parent or carer). The children walk through the sacristy into the parish hall where the liturgy is held. Activities include prayers; the Gospel reading and activity. The children return to the church during the Offertory, ready for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. ST BART'S CATHOLIC WOMEN'S LEAGUE

The Catholic Women's League (CWL) is a National (and International) Organisation which was formed in 1906 to give organised practical support to the Church. When St. Bart's Parish began its life in 1964, the CWL was one of its first Parish Groups to be established. Over the years since, its members were instrumental in organising and supporting various social and spiritual parish activities. Many of the CWL members were involved in most of the Church Ministries as well.

Although the prominence of the practical work has declined, we continue with our spiritual and social activities e.g., House Mass, Pilgrimages or Day of Reflection, Outings, and entertaining social Get-Togethers with neighbouring CWL Groups. We give caring and supportive friendship to each other, and to others in need of it, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Our Meetings take place in the St Bart's Parish Hall on the second Wednesday of each month, 14.15 for a 14.30 start. They consist of a time of prayer, a time of business and a lot of chat before, during and after a cuppa. Ladies, you are most welcome to drop in to meet us and get to know us (without feeling committed to membership) and join in any of the events on our planned Programme. HCPT AT ST BART'S

HCPT, The Pilgrimage Trust, is a national charity offering pilgrimage holidays, to Lourdes in the south of France, for disabled and disadvantaged people from around the UK and further afield. HCPT is a Catholic charity, and its services are open to all. Volunteers and beneficiaries come from all walks of life and from all faiths and none. Every Easter over 1,000 disabled and disadvantaged children enjoy a week in Lourdes, staying in hotels with their volunteer helpers. Each Summer over 1,500 people, many of them disabled adults, enjoy a week at HCPT's Hosanna House in Bartrès near Lourdes.

HCPT Group 149 is our local Parish group serving the needs of children from St Albans and the surrounding areas and is run with the full support of the Parish church of St Bartholomew's. The group consists of c.25 people a mix of helpers and guests. Every year we work to raise sufficient funds to take up to ten local children to Lourdes in France during the week after Easter. The children we take come from all walks of life and have a huge variety of needs, be they social, physical, emotional, economic, or simply a combination of any of these.

The very simple motto of the charity and of our group is that 'no one gets left behind.' Our aim is for the children's travel costs and needs to be covered entirely by the group and as such the fundraising needs of the group year-on-year are significant, the estimated cost of taking a child to Lourdes is around £800. We must raise more than £25,000 a year to make this a reality.

ST BART'S JUSTICE AND PEACE GROUP

- Do you want to bring about God's kingdom of justice, peace, and love?
- Are you concerned about human rights?
- Do you hate war and wish to seek ways of resolving conflicts peacefully?
- If so, St Bartholomew's Justice and Peace group is for you.

Our Parish Justice and Peace group began in the 1990s, meeting monthly in the home of members until a few years ago. More recently, we meet after the Saturday morning Mass in the St Bart's Committee Room. We are inspired by the Gospels and Catholic Social Teaching (some of the Vatican's best kept secrets) to respond to the demands of justice, both in our society and the wider world.

We support each other and local schemes both through prayer and practical actions. In recent years, we have assisted with the launch and running of the *St Albans Food Bank.* Some years before, we played a part in the launch of the local Credit Union. More recently, we have provided support for the *Catholic Worker Farm.*

As a small group with a wide remit, we have to restrict ourselves to a few major concerns each year. However, most years we provide support for *Pax Christi,* through the *Peace* Sunday appeal and for the work of *CAFOD* through the spring and autumn *Family Fast Days.* However, we are perhaps best known for our annual *Fairtrade lunches*, previously held in the Fairtrade fortnight.

ST BART'S ST VINCENT DE PAUL (SVP) CONFERENCE

The *St Vincent de Paul Society* is part of an international Christian voluntary network dedicated to tackling poverty, in all its forms by providing practical assistance to people in need. Our 10,000 members, motivated by their faith, visit vulnerable or isolated people across the UK and offer them friendship and practical support. The essence of our work is person-to-person contact and spending time with people is our greatest gift.

The main thrust of our work in this area is with the elderly, but we help others as the need arises. We visit people in their own homes, in residential care and take weekly Holy Communion to those who cannot get to Mass. We do shopping for those who find it difficult and help with transport to Mass, to hospital or doctor's appointments. We also help families that require both practical and financial help.

The St Bart's Conference currently has 8 members who meet twice monthly, and we have several auxiliary members we can call on if we need extra support. If you are interested in finding out more about St Bart's SVP, please contact Fr Francis or myself. *Anne McCarthy*

ST BART'S PILGRIMS CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMUNITY

We are currently a group of 10 people, from different Christian denominations who meet twice a month to pray together and support each other in our faith and in our lives.



Our group is part of the international Ignatian Christian Life Community (CLC) which means we are a group of Christians who are committed to gather together to pray and to share where we find God in our lives. Our meetings are based around the gospels, using Sunday readings or materials produced by the CLC of England and Wales. Every so often we enjoy celebrating in a more social gathering e.g. Christmas.

We are looking to invite new members either to our group, or, if numbers allow, to start a new group. Either way, new members would be supported, both by an experienced guide and by materials which have been produced by the CLC to introduce them to this way of praying. New members will be invited to attend four meetings to see whether this sort of prayer group suits them; after this time they will be formally welcomed.

ST. BART'S FOOD PANTRY (SBFP)

At our November 2022 Parish Council meeting it was agreed to set up a food pantry in the church entrance to support parishioners, their family, friends and/or neighbours with free food provisions during this cost-of-living crisis. We are working with our parishioners, our parish group networks and St.



Adrian's Primary School to strengthen our pastoral care in the wider community to make sure no one is left hungry in this age of plenty. Initially we are providing nonperishable food but hope to progress to offering fresh fruit and vegetables in the future. Bags are provided to take the items away and the church opening times are displayed outside the church and on our social media platforms. ST BART'S MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE

ST BART'S FINANCE COMMITTEE

Canon law stipulates that each Parish should have a finance committee to help the Parish Priest in "the administration of the goods of the Parish". The Diocese has determined the role and responsibilities of the committee. The main elements are:

- The oversight and management of all the funds in the Parish.
- The operation of the diocesan accounting package (OPAS).
- The setting of an annual budget and the periodic review of income and expenditure against that budget.
- The operation of the *Gift Aid* scheme and *Planned Giving* campaigns.
- The production of annual accounts for audit.
- Ensuring that Parish property is well maintained and that any relevant health and safety or employment legislation is complied with.

The committee monitors the Parish support of various charities during the year. There are two types of recipients:

- Our main regular ongoing recipients HCPT and SVP.
- One off contributions to various charities e.g., CCS and Peter's pence.

The committee also has the right to be consulted by the Parish Priest over large items of expenditure and the viability of any proposed Parish projects. The St Bart's Finance Committee comprises:

- Angela Gray OPAS oversight, budget monitoring
- Eamon Rafferty Property maintenance, PPC liaison

The committee meets between four and six times a year and full minutes are kept of those meetings. Our last published accounts (displayed on the Parish web site) were for the year ending 31st December 2019. The accounts for 2020 and 2021 will be made available shortly as part of an update of our financial communications.

ST BART'S PARISH WEBSITE

The website for St Barts (St Albans South parish) is <u>https://parish.rcdow.org.uk/stalbanssouth/</u> It is updated weekly for the parish newsletter and during the pandemic, for the weekend Mass missalette, so that parishioners can follow the words of liturgy from their homes if they wish. Those items can be found on the Newsletter web page.



The Parish Pastoral Council helps with the review and update of all the website content and is considering other website and social media options. It is provided by the Diocese in the form of a parish microsite, created using a popular website content management system called WordPress. St Bart's Diocese microsite started life in late 2013 managed directly by the Parish Priest. It is now maintained by a small group of parish volunteers. All Parishes in the Diocese may have a microsite. They are uniform in layout and shape and designed to be a simple resource for parishes to use to develop an online presence without a large amount of web knowledge. The microsite has pages directly managed by the parish, some jointly managed with the Diocese, and some managed directly by the Diocese based on data the Diocese has about the parish. The Parish Priest is the person responsible for the St Barts content on the website and for the people who publish pages or stories on the site. If you think you see something wrong on the website or have suggestions or skills to offer, please contact the Parish Office.

ST BART'S SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding is about keeping you safe from harm. This includes protecting the right of us all to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect.

Our Parish Safeguarding Officer is Chris Blandford. The role of your Parish Safeguarding Officer is to assist in the:

- Safer recruitment of volunteers to Parish roles
- Initiation of DBS procedures where these are a legal requirement for activities with children and adults at risk



- Initial handling of any concerns or allegations
- Promotion of a 'Culture of Safeguarding' in the parish community

If you think you are being abused or neglected here are some things you can do:

- Tell someone you trust, a friend, family member or professional who will understand and help you take action
- Talk about your concerns with a professional e.g. teacher, support worker, doctor, social worker or nurse.
- Contact your Parish Safeguarding Officer or your local Council's Safeguarding team
- Talk to the police or ask someone you trust to help you to speak to the police

The Newman Association

Members of the Newman Association meet together in local Circles to listen to talks and to discuss and develop their understanding of the Christian faith. The link with St John Henry (Cardinal) Newman is his wish for "a laity who know their religion, who enter into it, who know what they hold and what they do not, who know their creed so well that they can give an account of it"

The Hertfordshire Circle of the Newman Association is one of the most active circles in the country. We arrange regular meetings during the period from September to June each year in a programme of talks and discussions around topical Catholic matters such as the recent exhortations by Pope Francis and various theological and historical issues. Most of the meetings are in parishes in or around St Albans, including St Barts, but we have also had joint events with St Albans Cathedral Study Centre and the University of Hertfordshire. We also have an active social calendar with pub lunches, a musical evening and a garden party. All are welcome to attend our talks.

We now regularly meet in person again (after the Covid restrictions ended), but tend to use Zoom meetings for winter/evening talks

Nationally the Newman Association organises conferences and events, and produces a regular journal: *website <u>www.newman.org.uk.</u>* Periodically a group of members goes on a "pilgrimage", which combines spiritual, cultural and social dimensions.
