DIVINE MERCY

Pope Francis has called God's mercy "an abyss beyond our comprehension." "God's mercy can make even the driest land become a garden, can restore life to dry bones (Ez 37:1-14)," the pope said in his very first Easter urbi et orbi message in 2013.

"Let us be renewed by God's mercy, let us be loved by Jesus, let us enable the power of his love to transform our lives, too," he continued, "and let us become agents of this mercy, channels through which God can water the earth, protect all creation, and make justice and peace flourish."

How to pray the Divine Mercy novena: The novena consists of praying a daily Chaplet of Divine Mercy along with specific prayer intentions for each day. The chaplet is prayed on rosary beads as follows:

The Lord's Prayer

Hail Mary

Apostles' Creed

On each of the large rosary beads say:

Eternal Father, I offer to you the body and blood, soul and divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On each of the small rosary beads say:

For the sake of his sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclude by saying three times: Have mercy on us and on the whole world. Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Response to the Psalm Today: Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end.

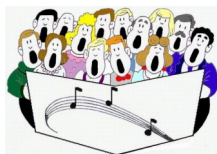


POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION April:
