Take up your cross and follow me.

Peter is such a human person: he doesn't want his leader Jesus to suffer or come to any harm, and tries to persuade Jesus to follow a safer path. And for his troubles Jesus says "Get behind me, Satan!" Things have clearly changed since last week: "You are a happy man" Jesus said just before this. Peter will have authority over Jesus' mission. However, today Jesus turns on Peter and chases him away. Why has Jesus taken such harsh exception to what Peter has said to him? And why does Jesus want the disciples to hear the lesson - and us too? Jesus spells that out quite clearly for Peter and the disciples, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me." It is clear we can't take the cross out of our religion. We can't take it out of our daily consciousness either. We may not suffer on the same kind of cross Jesus did, or be martyred the way so many who have followed him have been. But still, Jesus tells us we must each take up our cross and follow him -- and the cross costs us something.

Paul tells us today: "Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind.. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do." There are plenty of people around to remind us that the cross is still in need of being picked up. People continue to die from sickness and disease, neighbours continue to live in fear of destitution. The world at our doorstep and the world beyond our shores are examples of the continuing need of people who are prepared to follow Christ's lead and to bring healing, comfort, and compassion to others.
