Synod Meeting #2

Q3. What concrete steps/formation opportunities?

Group prayer and group activities. More prayer groups. Teach the history of our church, organise pilgrimages. Organise weeks of guided prayer. Groups to support our families, our young people, people who live on their own.

Use the “way of the Cross” outdoors (with leaflets) to evangelise. Stream Mass online. Ecumenical palm Sunday. Visit schools with message. More technology.

Q4. What structures need to change/develop?

Add more groups: youth, post-Confirmation, young families/couples. Talent within the parish should be acknowledged/developed. Have a parish council. Regular parishioner feedback sessions. More dialect Masses with visiting priests in different languages. More social gatherings throughout the year to bring the different language groups together – at the moment there is too much separation between the language groups. What happened to the Children’s “Christmas Mass”? Encourage older teens to become catechists.
