#### **GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY**

On the fourth Sunday of Easter a passage from chapter 10 of John's Gospel is always read, and this year we hear the middle bit. The chapter is about the Good Shepherd, as Jesus described himself, as opposed to those who did not care for their sheep as they ought to. The image of sheep and shepherds for the people and their leaders pervades the Bible and was adopted by the Church, so that the Pope is the chief shepherd, assisted by the bishops and parish clergy. This was easily understood in an agricultural society but is less obviously applicable to an industrial one. You have to go a long way from here to find sheep safely grazing, but I think we can still understand the image and the message it contains. Gilbert and Sullivan referred to a policeman's lot as not a happy one, and the same might be said of the shepherd's (see 'A Shepherd's Life' by James Rebanks).

It takes guite a lot of work to put the leg of lamb on the dinner table. Despite their importance culturally shepherds were rather looked down on in biblical times, but it was to them that the birth of the Saviour was announced in the nativity story, and they were the first set of visitors to be welcomed at the crib, in stark contrast to the opulence of the magi with their extravagant gifts; the shepherds brought only themselves, and probably a sheep or lamb or two as often depicted in art. Pope Francis has emphasised that he wants priests and especially bishops to have the 'smell of the sheep' about them, by which he means that they must be connected to the people they serve and not aloof from them. On this Sunday there is always a collection for the training of future priests, and here that goes to the seminarians for the diocese of Westminster (not the Jesuits!). There are envelopes at the back of the church if you wish to contribute that way. But as well as contributing it is

important, indeed essential, to continue to pray for vocations and for those studying for the priesthood (it takes a long time!) (Fr. John)

We also have one seminarian in Valladolid and one at the Beda, presently on pastoral placement in Ruislip. There are also two on a propaedeutic year at Redemptoris Mater. Last year 3 deacons were ordained for Westminster Diocese. The Priest Training Fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained priests.
