Salt

"You are the salt of the earth" (Mt 5:13). Let us explore what our Lord could mean when he refers to us as salt from today's Gospel. On a purely practical level, salt adds flavour, it can bring food to life; both Leviticus (2:13) and Ezekiel (43:24) advise that sacrificial offerings made to the Lord must be seasoned, sprinkled with salt; however, the sprinkling of salt has a deeper meaning. In Numbers (18:19), 2 Chronicles (13:5), and Leviticus (2:13) we read of a covenant of salt. Holy Scripture speaks of this covenant, this bond between man and God, as lasting forever. The covenant of salt is mentioned in reference to the eternal kingship of David (2 Chron 13:5): Jesus is the eternal King, from the line of David (Lk 1:32, Mt 1:20-21); and in reference to perpetual offerings to Levi priests (Num 18:19): Jesus has become the eternal high priest (Heb 4:14). So references to a covenant of salt teaches us that the Lord our God wishes to establish eternal bonds with us, and, further, that these eternal bonds have been definitively revealed in Jesus. So salt can represent God's eternal commitment to each of us. But there is still more. Jesus says that we are, "the salt of the earth". So this covenant which God has established is to have an abiding effect, a perpetual guidance on our lives, which points to our, "Father in heaven" (Mt 5:16). We need to be made salty! In Mark's Gospel, we read, "for every one will be salted with fire" (Mk 9:49). When we refer to fire we can readily picture the fire of the Holy Spirit descending on the Apostles and Mary in the Upper Room at Pentecost, "and there appeared to them tongues as of fire" (Acts 2:3). This salty fire, which is the joy of the risen Jesus Christ, is the power behind centuries of ongoing charitable acts by Christians for others; it is the living power behind the holy and virtuous lives of families bringing their children up to embrace the purity of chastity and the sanctity of marriage; it is the power behind countless men and women giving their lives in service of Jesus in His Church for the salvation of others. Beloved in Christ, to be a Christian is to be salty. May we truly seek to live lives of such radiant joy, always persevering in the Lord, Who died and rose for each of us. May Jesus, our Lord, never have cause to say that we have lost our saltiness. Fr Ben
