In Your Light We See Light (Ps 36:9)

So we have arrived at the Fourth Sunday of Lent. It is called *Laetare* (rejoice) Sunday on account of the Entrance Antiphon, in Latin, taken from Isaiah 66:10-11. These two verses, 10-11, focus on the joy of Jerusalem and on all those who love her, as they are satisfied by her consoling breasts. There is a sense here of Jerusalem as the mother, who is nursing and consoling her children. This is very suitable considering that today we honour and give thanks for the immeasurable gifts of mothers, on this Mothers' Day. Daffodils will be available after Mass to offer as gifts to all mothers. Isaiah 66 is the last chapter of the great Prophet's book. In that chapter we are given an account of the eternal day, when evil will be finally defeated and peoples from all nations will come, adore and worship the Lord on His holy mountain Jerusalem. This rejoicing on Laetare Sunday is thus inseparable from the ultimately victorious spiritual battle which is always present in the Christian life. Central to the themes from the readings is the gift of the Lord to us to see truthfully. The Gospel starts with the statement that the man seen by Jesus had been blind from birth. The disciples fail to understand that this reality is foundationally true through the Original Sin. All of us are born blind by the stain of Original Sin. As Jesus is the Lamb of God, as hailed by Saint John the Baptist, His very earthly presence is the cause for all sin to be eradicated. Jesus was sent for this (Jn 3:17; 9:4; 17:3). The man obeys Jesus: he goes and washes in the Pool of Siloam, which means 'sent'. There he receives the miracle of new birth, he can see, washed, baptised, in the Spirit of Him Who was sent. Note that when he is healed the man refers to himself as, "I am the man" (Jn 9:9); the Greek says, "ego eimi", which translates as, "I am". Jesus is the great, "I am" - the Bread of Life; the Good Shepherd; the Light of the world; the Way, the Truth, and the Life; the True Vine. So when the man says, "I am", this reflects how in Baptism we become another Christ, another, "I am". The man can now see, and encounters blindness in others. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, who has been given the gift to see aright, we will encounter those who fight to hold onto blindness and evil; but as part of the heavenly Jerusalem, we must, like the man healed, worship the Lord, and rejoice.
