### Come Out, Come Out, Wherever You Are

Three years ago last Sunday the church was open only for private prayer and I had to ask you to leave so that I could celebrate and stream the Mass. By this, the fifth Sunday of Lent, when I veiled the statues, the church was closed since the lockdown was in full swing. While the veiling of statues is designed to highlight that this time of year is different and important, to help us focus on the words of the liturgy, and to create a sense of anticipation of the joy of Easter, three years ago the fact that you were all hidden really brought home to me how you, the people, are one of the joys of a parish. And for you, as so many said during the Synodal conversations, not having access to the Lord truly present in the Eucharist veiled Him from your senses. Thus it was a wonderful day when you and the Lord were face-to-face once more. And that wouldn't have been possible without all those who volunteered to clean the church each day and to steward at Mass for so many months. But where has that great volunteer spirit gone? I say that because the only "easier" things in lockdown were First Holy Communion and Confirmation classes because for all the drawbacks of being online, there were no safeguarding issues to address. But now that we are meeting in person with our children and young people, the ratios of candidates to catechists (seven to one) must be followed. And therein lies the difficulty—apart from the parish team, we have five catechists out of nearly 1000 parishioners, a feeble one in 200 people, which is, by law, simply not enough to prepare all those who wish to celebrate these Sacraments in this, their own parish. Yes, Fr Ben and I have asked people to help with eleven Communion classes or nine Confirmation sessions a year, but with little success. Hence next year will see just 21 first come, first served places for each Sacrament. Any further children will be turned away. And when that happens, the first death-knell of your parish's future will have tolled. We can say Mass, hear Confessions, visit the sick, manage the buildings and finances, but by law we cannot catechise without more adults present. So I beg you, gaze upon those veiled statues and ask, is your vocation to be the first and best teachers of our children hidden too? If it is, please be a gift to our children by uniting with those saints and unveiling your noble and generous hearts to us at Easter. Fr Kevin
